Meet The Presenter: **Mackenzie Wilfong** earned her Bachelors of Arts from the University of Oklahoma where she graduated Phi Beta Kappa, she received her Juris Doctorate degree from Southern Methodist University's Dedman School of Law. Following law school, Mackenzie practiced litigation at a national law firm in Kansas City where she specialized in Education and Employment Law, practicing in both Kansas and Missouri. After leaving private practice, she joined the United States Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights as a federal enforcement attorney investigating allegations of harassment and discrimination in a five-state region during both the late Bush and early Obama administrations. Most recently, for nine years Mackenzie worked for OSU and its Board in several roles including Associate General Counsel for the Board of Regents of the Oklahoma State University and Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges, representing nine Colleges and Universities across Oklahoma. Currently, Mackenzie is the General Counsel for Tulsa Community College, where she serves on the Executive Team and provides legal counsel to the College's four campuses serving 23,000 students in Tulsa County. Mackenzie is a Board member of the Oklahoma Center for Community and Justice and co-authored a chapter on the First Amendment in Higher Education for the recently published book *Student Conduct Practice: The Complete Guide for Student Affairs Professionals*.
