**Stephanie Bailey, CPA:**

**Casey Chapman:**

Previously, Johnson served as president of Southeastern Oklahoma State University for ten years, as director of public policy at the University of Oklahoma (OU), and adjunct professor of law at the OU College of Law. From 1982 to 1996, Johnson served in the Oklahoma House of Representatives, serving as Speaker of the House from 1990 to 1996. At the time of his election as Speaker, he was the youngest sitting Speaker of the House in the United States.

Faustina has worked for the University of Oklahoma since 1999. She is currently the Associate Equal Opportunity & Title IX Officer for the Institutional Equity Office. Faustina serves as the initial contact for complaints involving discrimination, harassment, or sexual misconduct. She conducts investigations in order to resolve the complaint.
